2ND PRE-POLL SURVEY ON BIHAR ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS – 2025 (As on 02.10.2025)

Present Survey Details and Methodology

1. Sample strength (2ND Pre-Poll Survey)

Total number of samples collected in 243 Assembly constituencies in 2 phases – **64,300 only.**

2. Time Frame for 2nd phase Pre-Poll Survey

During 25.08.2025 to 02.10.2025

3. SAS Group (IITians Group), with I.P.S.S Team Hyderabad, conducted a comprehensive field survey across 243 Assembly constituencies in Bihar,

NOTE: All the samples, were collected on field (i.e direct contact with the voters) only. No online, SMS, telephonic samples are entertained in the survey.

4. The sampling methodology incorporated a mix of stratified (selective) and random sampling in 50% : 50% ratio, ensuring

balanced representation from diverse segments of the population.(50% of male and 50% of female voters are taken)

5.The survey was carefully designed to reflect the socio-economic and political demographics of Bihar state covering all the 5 regions (Seemanchal, ANG Pradesh, Midilanchal, North bihar and Magadh Regions).

6.The sampling ensures inclusivity across all age groups, gender, caste, religion income levels and urban – rural divides.

7.With rigorous field work and scientifically grounded sampling techniques, the survey achieved an average margin of error between 1% to 1.5% ensuring reliability and credibility of the findings.

Selective (stratified) samples covers the following strata of voters including.

8. Male & Female voters of age group (18-35 years, 36-45 years, 46-55 years, 56-60 years and above 60 years).

9.State government and retired state government employees.

10. Farmers & lease farmers.

11. Beneficiaries of all government welfare schemes to assess the satisfaction levels among voters.

12. Wage seekers

13. Employed in private sector.

14. Unemployed youth

15. BC & EBC community

16. SC Community

17. Muslim Community.

18. College and university students.

19. Small & Middle class business persons

20. Poor, Very poor, Middle class and rich income group voters.

21. Housewives

22. Local body leaders (irrespective party)

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OBSERVATIONS:

1. Extreme consolidation of Yadav and muslim community voters towards MGB (INDIA) .
2. Young and unemployed youth are frustrated (vexed) with NDA ruling (from 2020-2025) in Bihar.
3. Considerable percentage of voters are supporting to Jan Suraj Party (Prasant Kishore) in urban areas.
4. JSP (Jan Suraj Party) will play key role in 2025 assembly elections in Bihar. Due to JSP, NDA alliance will be effected in number of MLA seats in urban areas.
5. Northern region of Bihar will decided the elections result.
6. No impact of operation “SINDHOOR” on Bihar assembly elections in 2025.
7. No.of corruption charges on present MLAs in Bihar.
8. Lack of basic infrastructure (ie) Primary health centres and Road facilities in rural areas of Bihar.
9. Final assembly election results 2025 will depend on the seat sharing among alliance partners of NDA and MGB.
10. Rajput, Brahmin, Bhumihar, Community voting is divided upto certain extent due to this NDA will loose certain percentage of vote share among the above mentioned communities.
11. SIR will be a deciding factor in Bihar.
12. Some communities belongs to EBC, and MBC voting is also divided between MGB and NDA. In 2025 assembly elections NDA can't secure more percentage of vote share in EBC and MBC communities like 2020 assembly elections

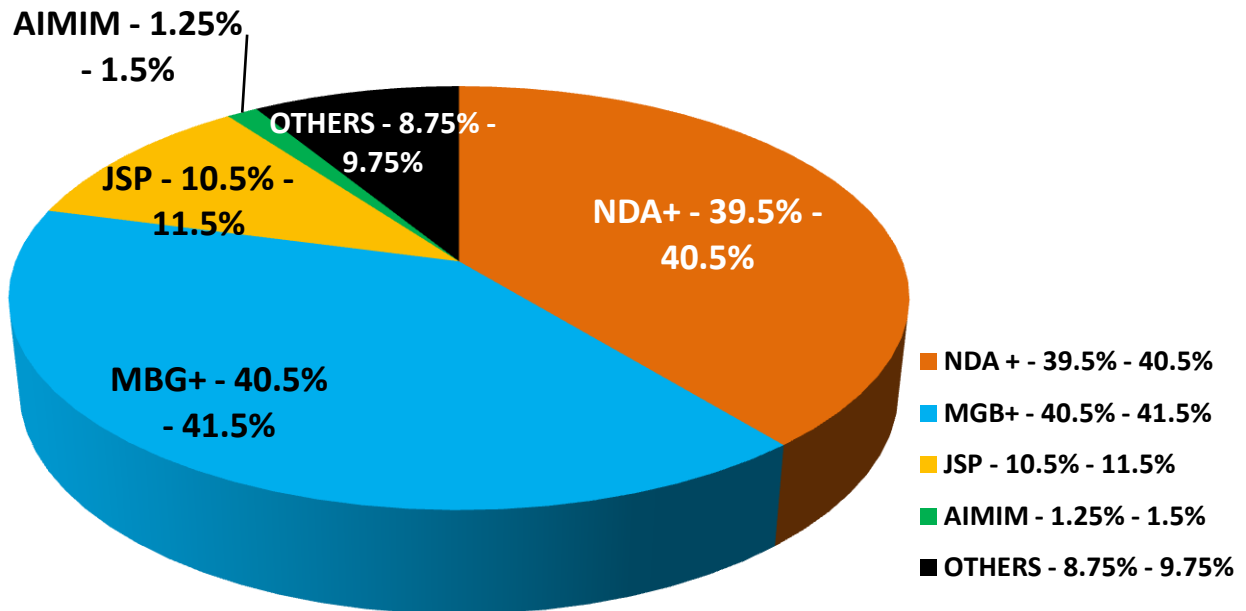

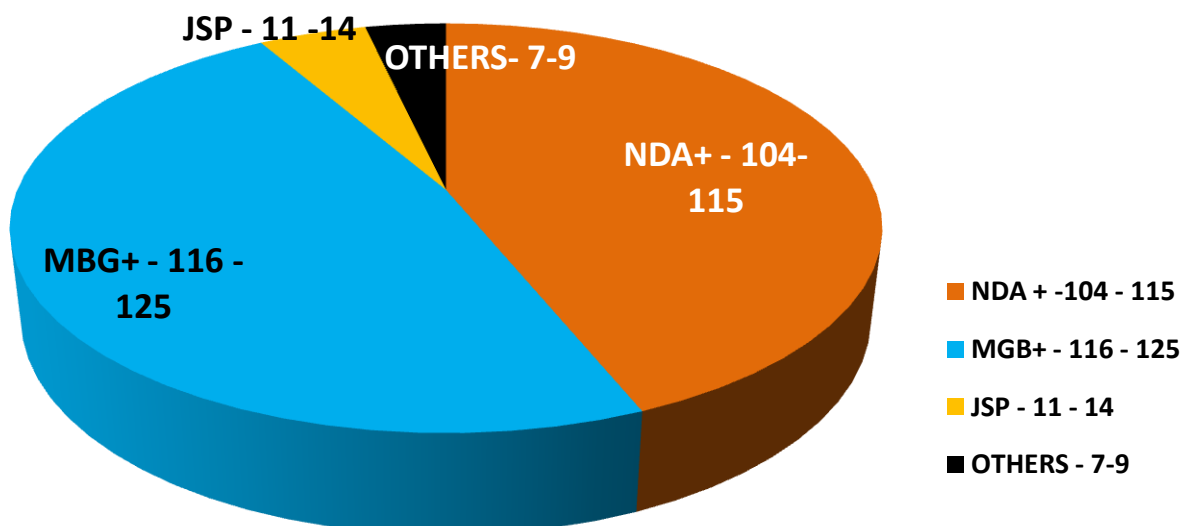
PROJECTION OF ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCIES
